### NOTES FOR ALL HORSE EXHIBITORS

**A COMBINED ENTRY FORM AND STATEMENT WILL BE FOUND FOLDED IN THE CENTRE OF THE SCHEDULE. PLEASE NOTE ONE EXHIBITOR PER ENTRY FORM, BOTH COPIES MUST BE RETURNED.**

**ENTRY FEES:** Entry fees are set out at the top of each page. Please note that the Members Rates refer to fully paid up, current Members of the East of England Agricultural Society

**LOOSE BOXES:** Available on payment of £30.00 + VAT (£35.25 total) per box for one night; £60.00 + VAT (£70.50 total) for period of Show. Available from 5.00pm on night prior to judging until 5.00pm the day of Show.

**PLEASE NOTE THERE ARE NO PERMANENT STABLES ON THE SHOWGROUND.**

### **2008 NEW SHOWGROUND LAYOUT**

Day horse boxes will be parked outside the perimeter fence of the Showground. ***Please make sure that you follow the signs and enter by the appropriate gate as marked on the gate label sent to you with your tickets.*** Horse boxes staying overnight will be parked near the stable lines. Please ensure that you take notice of the Stewards and park as directed.

**JUDGING DAYS** Horses are only required on the Showground on the day exhibited.

### **PLEASE READ CAREFULLY**

- 1) Enclosed with this schedule is:-  
A combined entry form and statement folded in the centre of the schedule.  
Horses of different categories may be included on a single entry form
- 2) Reminders about entries closing dates will not be sent.
- 3) Entries will not be acknowledged unless a SAE is enclosed with entries. The only acknowledgement will be when the badges and labels are sent to you at the end of May.
- 4) Judging times are as accurate as possible at the time of printing this schedule, but it is advisable to check with the official programme nearer to the Show.
- 5) Entries **MUST** be on the correct form and both carbon sheets must be returned. (Please note that there are separate entry forms for Light Horses, Heavy Horses, Livestock & Show Jumping)
- 6) Judging is in timetable order unless otherwise stated.
- 7) **BEDDING** - would exhibitors be kind enough to bring their own bedding as limited straw only will be available on the showground for horses.
- 8) Would exhibitors also bring their own fodder and mangers or feed containers as these are not provided.
- 9) For reasons of safety and to prevent nuisance the Council of the Society has decided that dogs can only be permitted on the Showground during the Summer Show whilst on a lead. Motor Bikes or Quad Bikes will not be permitted on the Showground.
- 10) The Committee reserves the right to measure any type of class by their official Veterinary Surgeon on the Showground unless exhibitors are able to produce a Life Certificate to the Veterinary Surgeon and / or Steward in charge on the day.

### **CANCELLATION OF/OR ALTERATION TO CLASSES**

The Council reserves the right to cancel, divide or amalgamate or otherwise change any class or to limit entries in any class or section from any entrant. The Chairman and Vice Chairman of Council and Senior Steward of the appropriate section are given executive powers in connection with this regulation.

**EXTRACT FROM BY-LAWS**

- a) All Classes are open unless otherwise stated. Entries are to be made at the fees stated in the current Prize List. All stock exhibited for prizes shall be bona fide in the legal ownership of the exhibitor at the time of entry, or for such a period as shall be set out under the conditions of the particular class concerned.
- b) **ENTRY FEES ARE NOT REFUNDABLE** in respect of individual animals that are withdrawn before the Show or are not forward at the Show even though a Veterinary Certificate is produced to account for the withdrawal or absence of such entry.
- c) All stabling is subject to availability. Stabling fees are NOT refundable unless applied for in writing by the 2nd June 2008. A £10 administration charge will be made per cancelled stable. ALL stables will be 10' x 12'.
- d) Incorrect entries may not be transferred.
- e) **LATE ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCE.**
- f) **PARADE** - It is an express condition of entry in the Heavy Horse sections that 1st, 2nd and 3rd prize-winning animals must be prepared to parade in the Equine Ring or elsewhere at the time or times stated in the Show Programme or as directed by the Steward. Any exhibitor or groom refusing to bring their horses on parade at the specified time when requested by the Stewards may forfeit any prizes won by the animal in question; and prizes so forfeited if already presented must be returned to the Society at once.
- g) **HALTERS.** Horses must have proper halters when on the Showground.
- h) **VETERINARY INSPECTIONS.** Animals sent for exhibition may at any time on the instructions of the Judges, Stewards or other Officials of the Society be inspected by the Society's Veterinary Surgeons. The Veterinary Surgeons will be instructed to order the removal from the Showground of any animal which, in their opinion, is affected by any disease likely to prove harmful to other animals or is in any way unfit for exhibition. The Veterinary Surgeons shall hand a certificate recording their findings to the person in charge of any rejected animal.
- i) **EQUINE INFLUENZA.** It is strongly recommended that all horses, other than foals, receive a full course of Equine Influenza Vaccination as recommended by The British Equine Association within the 12 months prior to the Show. Passports must accompany animals to the Show. The vaccination of foals is left to the discretion of the owner and his Veterinary Surgeon.
- j) The age of horses to be calculated from 1st January in the year of their birth.
- k) Brood Mares must have their own foals at foot.
- l) **CONCEALING EXHIBITS DURING THE SHOW.** During the time the Show is open to the public no sheeting or other material may be affixed to any part of the livestock accommodation in such a way that any animal is concealed from public view.
- m) **HARD HATS.** It is the sole responsibility of riders to ensure that at all times whilst on horseback, they wear correctly fitting protective headgear which complies with the latest British Standard. The Society accepts no responsibility for any injury arising from a failure to comply with this regulation.
- n) **NOMINATION AND SUBSTITUTION ENTRIES ARE NOT ALLOWED.**
- o) **CONTAGIOUS DISEASE** - All exhibitors are asked to be aware of animals on the Showground and ensure that all exhibits are fit and well. If any exhibitor has reason to believe that an animal is unfit, please report this to the Veterinary Centre or the Livestock Office.
- p) **HORSE WALKWAYS** – Horses must move between rings and horseboxes on the horse walkways whenever possible.
- q) **NO LUNGEING ALLOWED ON THE SHOWGROUND IN EITHER THE COLLECTING RINGS OR STABLE AREAS.**

**LIVESTOCK GENERAL NOTES**

- 1) **ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION, BY-LAWS AND REGULATIONS:**
  - (a) The organisation of the East of England Country Show is under the control of a Council, which consists of representatives of the participating Agricultural Societies.
  - (b) The Show is held under the Articles of Association, by-laws and Regulations of the East of England Agricultural Society, which accordingly bind all exhibitors, members of the participating Agricultural Societies and all others attending the Show.
  - (c) **COMPLIANCE WITH GOVERNMENT AND LOCAL AUTHORITY REGULATIONS AND ALL CODES OF PRACTICE:** All Shows, Exhibitions and Events organised by the Society on the Showground or elsewhere are subject to any relevant Orders issued by Government Departments and Local Authorities, and all Codes of Practice with which all exhibitors and other attending such Shows, Exhibitions or Events must comply.
  - (d) Exhibitor's attention is also drawn to the breed regulations and competition conditions printed in this Prize List.

- (e) Copies of the Articles of Associations, by-laws and Regulations can be obtained on request to the Secretary of the Society.
- 2) **PRIZE MONEY: FOURTH, FIFTH AND SIXTH** prizes where published will only be awarded in classes where 8, 12 and 16 entries are made respectively for light horses and ponies. All prizes will be paid irrespective of entries for heavy horses.
- 3) **RADIUS:** The radius for the purpose of local classes at the East of England Show is 30 miles from the East of England Showground and/or the counties of Bedfordshire, Cambridgeshire and Northamptonshire.
- 4) **SCHEDULES** for other sections can be obtained on request.
- 5) **SOCIETY'S TROPHIES:** Exhibitors are reminded that without exception the Society's Trophies are for Perpetual Competition. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to return all trophies to the showground at least 30 days prior to the date of the Show.
- 6) **OBJECTIONS.** Any exhibitor at the Show feeling himself aggrieved must make his protest in writing within one hour of the completion of the judging of the class and pay a deposit to the Secretary of £25.00 (or other higher sum as determined by any organisation to which this Society is affiliated or acts under the rule of). Objections will not be entertained from any person or organisation not exhibiting in the same class as the animal to which the objection is raised. An Appeals Tribunal will consider objections, (excepting those handled by other appropriate organisations) at a time and place to be fixed by them and the person making the objection must be available to attend or, be presented by his authorised agent at the appointed time and place. The decision of the Appeals Tribunal shall be final, and if the protest be not substantiated the deposit may be forfeited. The animal to which the objection is raised must remain on the showground until permission to leave has been obtained from the Secretary in writing. The Society reserves to itself the right to refer an objection to any authority or organisation to adjudicate, wholly or in part, in respect of an objection, on behalf of a Society.
- 7) **BSPS QUALIFIERS**  
Affiliation number: BSPS 74/08. This Show is a qualifier for "BSPS Challenge". See classes for details.
- 8) **INSURANCE**
- (a) It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to insure all property and livestock on the Showground or elsewhere which is his own, or for which he is responsible.
- (b) The Society requires exhibitors to effect Employers Liability insurance where this is required by statute.
- (c) The Society also requires to effect Public Liability and Products Liability insurance with a minimum indemnity of £1,000,000 to protect their liability.
- 9) **TICKET ENTITLEMENT AND VEHICLE PASSES**  
3 Exhibitor Tickets will be sent for the first horse entered. For every subsequent horse entered one additional ticket will be sent. Please refer to the following table. Additional passes may be purchased in advance at a reduced rate.
